Other important reminders for your information and attention:

Punctuality:

Lessons begin at 8.50am prompt. Please ensure your child is on the yard from 8.45am to ensure they are settled and in class for the beginning of each lesson. School finishes at 3.10pm. Teachers begin planning meetings at 3.15pm so please do your best to collect on time. If you are running late, please ring the school office to let them know.

Screen time and online safety:

Please limit this to one hour maximum a day and ensure children are on APPS appropriate for their age. Children using inappropriate APPS is a safeguarding concern. We are speaking to parents weekly as problems and concerns are arising when children using their device unsupervised.

Lateral Flow Test and PCRs

From 11th January, PCR tests will no longer be compulsory following a positive Lateral Flow test. If your child tests positive on a Lateral Flow, please take a photo and email it to the school office for our records.

FSM applications:

If your circumstances have changed and you are receiving financial support, you may be entitled to Free School Meals, help with uniform and trips. Please complete a FSM application from the office to see if you qualify. Ms Coull can support you with the application if needed.

Safeguarding Children

Children's safety and well-being are our priority. Any welfare concerns should be shared with the class teacher and will be followed up with parents. It is our duty of care.

Any serious concerns will be reported to children's services following LA guidance.
