## 1. Review of SEND provision for academic year 2022-2023

RM's review of work undertaken this term:

Currently have 39 pupils at SEN support in school Boys 31 Girls 8 7 have HLN Local Authority funding 2 EHCP Autumn Term

- Met with outside agencies (Autism Team/ Visual Impairment Team/ Inclusive Education Service/ School Counsellor and Nottingham City SEND Team) to identify key pupils and plan for year ahead
- Organised CPD for Autumn Term/Spring Term

Spent some with RM looking through these particular sections to ensure school was adhering to the directives given.

**Findings**- All staff concerned with our SEND children, have regular safe guarding training and are fully aware of the extra difficulties involved when working with them eg non-verbal children. Staff communicate with each other on a daily basis and share concerns. All staff know what procedures to follow if an issue arises.

## 3. Update on child with severe allergies.

Discussed with RM issues concerning our pupil with severe allergies particularly regarding school meals. RM has liaised with our new school cook and the local authority's nutritionist. Further issues may arise next year if the pupil opts to bring a packed lunch.

Areas for development and issues to follow up further:

- All SEND policies to be reviewed in January 2023
- Review results of HLN bids from Autumn Term
- Report back to governors on SEND provision for 2022 -23
- Check that the SENCO continues to receive adequate 'time' to fulfil role.

Evaluation of visit:

RM continues to fulfil her role as SENCO to the highest standard. SEND provision was rated as Outstanding by Ofsted. Congratulations and huge thanks to RM and her team for their hard work and dedication to our special children.
