Over 80% of children read at least 4 times a week last term and <u>made the most progress in school.</u> Reading after dinner time before they get too tired is a good time to do it. Please remember to sign their diary once they have read to you. Our lunchtime reading room, run by staff, will continue to take place every day to give your child the opportunity to get their stamp.

Extra curricular clubs:

After school clubs will begin for KS1 and KS2 pupils, week beginning 15th January. Please collect your child on time when the clubs finish at 4pm. Siblings, who are not in the club, must be collected at 3.15pm as normal. These clubs are free of charge.

Safeguarding Children

Children's safety and well-being are our priority. Any welfare concerns should be shared with the class teacher and will be followed up with parents. It is our duty of care.

Any serious concerns will be reported to children's services following LA guidance. If concerns are discussed or reported we are not accusing anyone but merely asking for investigations to take place. Our Safeguarding Policy is on the website. Our school counsellor provides support for children and parents. Children are referred with parent's permission. An appointment can be made with her through the school office.
